


Eco-Heroes Materials List

Supplies to Have on Hand for Every Session



Additional Supplies for Specific Sessions

Session 1 (June 21) – For **Optional** Post-Session Activity

Pieces of corrugated cardboard (can be as small as a couple inches square)

Session 2 (June 22)

- Any material out of which to built about a 12" x 12" x 12" cube rulers, plastic knives, chop sticks, stiff wire, pipe cleaners, etc.
- O Adhesive/connectors to secure the corners of the cube tape, wire, string, etc.
- O Small containers dixie or other small cups, small jars, empty ice cube tray, etc.
- O Scooping/collecting tools plastic spoon, tweezers, etc.
- O Optional: digital camera/phone with which to take photographs



Session 3 (June 23)

- A pan or tray of some kind (cake pan, foil pan, frying pan, paint tray, etc.)
- O Enough sand or dirt to fill about half the pan
- O Water
- O Some sort of "paddling device" (battle, spatula, wooden spoon, etc.)
- Optional: Blue food coloring
- Materials to test as barriers rocks, gravel, plant material, clay/playdough, cotton balls, tissues, anything else from the Crafty Creative Reusables list!

For Optional Post-Session Activity

- O Two clear bowls or plastic containers
- Vegetable oil
- O Cocoa powder, any powdery spice, or food coloring
- O Cotton balls or pieces of cotton rags
- O Water
- Optional: craft feather

Session 4 (June 24) - For Optional Post-Session Activity

- Assorted plastic and other CLEANED/disinfected "throw-away" items look especially for the items that you can't reuse or recycle and that would otherwise go in the garbage
- Adhesive/connecting supplies (tape, glue, string, zip ties, etc.)
- O Optional: other assorted craft supplies (cardboard, fabric or paper scraps, yarn, etc.)







Crafty Creative Reusables

Before tossing or recycling something, think about how it could become an art-making material! The items on this list will often be described as miscellaneous or 3D materials in projects and activities. Some of these items may require being made into smaller, more manageable pieces. Some items on this list are marked with a * as they are items to consider purchasing specifically for craft use. If specific items are integral to your Adventure's activities, they will already be listed above.
