

Confucianism (rujiao 儒教) and Daoism (daojiao 道教)

Commonalities:

- Born in the political situation of the "Spring and Autumn" (春秋 777-476 B.C.) and "Warring States" (戰國 475-221 B.C.) periods.
 - o Concerned with rulership and survival (Confucius and Laozi)
 - Withdrawing from the situation (Zhuangzi and Liezi)
- Concept of the "Way" (Dao 道)
 - o As path
 - As directions
 - o As means to any goal
 - o As the "way" of things
- Early Chinese thought concerned with action, not substance

Confucius

Ritual Proprity (li 禮)

- Appropriateness (yi 義)
- Humanity (ren 仁)
- The Way/Dao
 - o A way without a destination
 - o A human way
- The "princely man" (junzi 君子)

Daoism

- The Dao
- Being and Nonbeing (you 有, wu 無)
- Yin and Yang (陰陽)
- The "Myriad Things" (wanwu 萬物)
- Reversion: returning to the source
- Non-action (wuwei 無為)
