FEB 28 Finland: lakes, forests and shore

Finland's remote forested, lake-dotted landscapes have inspired centuries of legend and song, such as its national epic, the Kalevala. Works by such Finnish composers as Jean Sibelius, Robert Kajanus and Einojuhani Rautavaara draw many themes from these rich sources. We enjoy Sibelius' evocative "Pohjola's Daughter" and study the fearsome political history underpinning his "Finlandia." We also marvel at Rautavaara's astonishing "Cantus Arcticus" and discover the gorgeous works of Uuno Klami, among other superb Finnish discoveries.
