## Northern Masters: Evocative Concert Music of Europe's Northern Countries

*Dr. Rachel Franklin*

Tuesday, February 21, 2023 - 12:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m. ET

Geography, geology, wind and weather, legend and language: all play a role in shaping the artistic vocabulary of national identity, and none more so than the countries situated around the wild oceans of the Baltic, North and Norwegian Seas.

The best-known composers from this region have long held a cherished place in our concert halls. Figures such as Edvard Grieg, Jean Sibelius, Carl Nielsen and Arvo Pärt have shaped our understanding of their varied cultures, exploring mysterious folklore, vast land, ice and seascapes, spiritual belief and turbulent history through their music.

In this 4-session course, popular speaker and concert pianist Rachel Franklin uses her unique live piano demonstrations and fascinating film clips to explore both well and lesser-known masterpieces from the ancient nations of the North.

British-born Franklin has been a featured speaker for organizations including the Library of Congress and NPR, exploring intersections among classical and jazz music, film scores, and the fine arts.

### WK 2. SYLLABUS & WORKS

#### **FEB 21: Denmark's classical heritage**

Well south of Norway and Sweden, Denmark is small but mighty, with a more continental feel. Its composing heritage stretches back beyond the Baroque era and one famed early master with a magnificent legacy was Dieterich Buxtehude. We then explore delightful works by Friedrich Kuhlau and Niels Gade, before immersing ourselves in the vibrant, noble music of Carl Nielsen, in particular his symphony no. 4, the "Inextinguishable."

Notable women composers include the groundbreaking works of Nancy Dalberg and Else Marie Pade, plus we enjoy a splendid Danish steam train ride with Hans Christian Lumbye, and float through cosmic spheres with the little-known, astounding sound world of Rued Langgaard.
