## PROJECT STILL IN PROGRESS (assisted by Christo's son and nephew):

The Mastaba: A Project for the United Arab Emirates; started in 1977. Intended to be the largest contemporary in the world, made from stacked, multicolored steel barrels, in Abu Dhabi.

## VERY BASIC BIOGRAPHY/IES:

- June 13, 1935—Christo Javacheff and Jeanne-Claude Denat de Guillebon both born—in Gabrovo, Bulgaria and Casablanca, Morocco, respectively.
- 1958, after living, studying, and searching for work in Sofia, Prague, & Vienna, Christo arrives in Paris, where Jeanne-Claude's family had moved; they meet, and fall in love.
- 1959, Christo and Jeanne-Claude marry.
- 1960, Their son, Cyril, is born. Christo begins wrapping objects and planning/executing larger projects.
- 1962, Christo has his first one-man exhibition, in Paris.
- 1964, Christo and Jeanne-Claude settle permanently in New York City.
- 1969, Christo's first massive project, *Wrapped Coast*, is realized. From then on, until his death, Christo (with the collaboration of Jeanne-Claude) continues planning and making many different projects, of various sizes, in various nations (see above). A number of projects are never realized, due to unsurmountable obstacles.
- 1973, Christo becomes a U.S. citizen; Jeanne-Claude does the same, in 1984.

1994, Christo goes back and retroactively adds Jeanne-Claude's name to all of the work made since 1961; thereafter, they receive dual credit.

2009, Jeanne-Claude dies, due to complications from a fall, November 18<sup>th</sup>, aged 74. 2020, Christo dies, May 31st, at 84.
