JUNE 7 Creatures of the Earth and Sky

The depiction of living creatures is one of the most delightful but challenging aspects of the composer's craft. Is it necessary to attempt a literal copy of an animal's call and, if not, what musical device could successfully invoke the sound? Such works as Dvorak's "American" string quartet, Saint-Saëns' "Carnival of the Animals" suite, Vaughan Williams' "The Lark Ascending" and Rimsky Korsakov's "Flight of the Bumble Bee" are among many examples in our enchanting menagerie.
