### JUNE 14 Water, Water Everywhere

Mighty oceans, torrential rivers, glittering fountains. Watery works abound across the concert repertoire. But how can music be wet? Can a composer ever truly recreate a sense of fluid motion? Voyage through the mightiest of seascapes, Debussy's *La Mer*, marvel at Liszt's electrifying portrayal of St. Francis walking on water Liszt; shiver on the stony beaches of Britten's "Sea Interludes," and delight in Respighi's sparkling images of Rome's famous fountains. Also included are works by Smetana, Mendelssohn, and whales!
