CLOVIS AND THE FRANKS: A QUICK TIMELINE

c.200-400	Franks established along the lower Rhine
476	Deposition of Romulus Augustulus (last western Roman emperor)
c.481	Death of Childeric (Tournai); "Accession" of Clovis
c.486	Defeat of Syagrius, son of Aegidius
c.495	Clovis' marriage to Burgundian princess Clothild
496	Traditional date of Clovis' baptism and Alamanni war
503/506	Possible dates for the Battle of Tolbiac against the Alamanni
507	Battle of Vouillé, Clovis defeats Visigothic king Alaric II
508	Possible date of Clovis' baptism
511	Death of Clovis, division of his kingdom (partitive inheritance)
534	The Franks conquer the Burgundians
561	Death of Chlothar I, redivision of the Frankish kingdom
569	Radegund promotes her Monastery of the Holy Cross at Poitiers
587	Treaty of Andelot between Childebert II, Guntram, and Brunhild
594	Death of Gregory of Tours (History of the Franks)
613	Reunification of the Frankish kingdoms of Neustria (west) and Austrasia (east) by Chlothar II; death of Brunhild
687	Battle of Tertry won by Austrasian mayor Pepin of Herstal
732	Muslim attack defeated by Pepin's son Charles Martel at Poitiers
751	The last Merovingian king, Childeric III, deposed by Pepin the Short, the first Carolingian ruler
800	Charlemagne (768-814) crowned emperor in Rome
