


## THE WARS OF THE ROSES

## KEY EVENTS IN THE "WARS OF THE ROSES"

1377: Edward III dies and Richard II becomes king
1399: Richard II deposed and Henry Bolingbroke becomes Henry IV
1422: Henry V dies and infant son becomes Henry VI (and heir to French throne)
1445: Henry VI marries Marguerite of Anjou, signaling peace with FRance
1450: Richard Duke of York returns from Ireland and seeks role in government
1453: Henry VI suddenly incapacitated by illness and unable to rule
1454: Richard Duke of York named Protector until Henry VI recovers
1455: 1st Battle St. Albans: York/Neville victorious, Somerset/Percy killed, Henry VI captured and taken to London, York named as Protector
1460: Richard Duke of York killed at Battle of Wakefield
1461: Battle of Towton; Edward Duke of York becomes Edward IV
1464: Edward IV marries Elizabeth of Woodville, many resist including Warwick
1470: Warwick leads defeat of Edward IV and restores Henry VI to throne
1471: Edward IV retakes throne; Henry VI, Prince Edward (heir), Warwick killed
1483: Edward IV dies, Edward V proclaimed king and disappears, Richard III crowned
1485: Henry Tudor defeats Richard III at Battle of Bosworth and becomes Henry VII
1487: Lambert Simnel rebellion; Henry VII prevails at Battle of Stoke Field
1490-99: Perkin Warbeck rebellion; Warbeck and Warwick executed in 1499
1509: Henry VII dies and Henry VIII peacefully takes throne and is crowned king
