The acid is firm and well-integrated with the rich, creamy flavors of lemon brioche, honeysuckle, and pie dough. The 2023 vintage demonstrates Chaleur Blanc at its best and will surely cellar beautifully for the next 15+ years.

Yamhill-Carlton Chardonnay

Sourced from our estate vineyard in the Yamhill-Carlton sub-AVA, our 2021 Yamhill-Carlton Chardonnay opens with tropical fruit notes, a touch of minerality, and a pixilated gravely structure on the finish.

Beginning with bud-break around April 15th through May and into mid-June, there was hardly any rain. By June 15th canopy growth was good and flowering was setup for a normal timeline. At that point, the rains came, approximately 2", providing much needed moisture in the vineyards. Rain was followed by three days of record temperatures of 116 degrees, and a warm July and August led to an earlier than normal start to picking. A relatively mild September with a slightly smaller than average crop set us up for an incredible harvest.

OUR VINEYARD

Nestled in the eastern foothills of Oregon's Coastal Range, on the wild western edge of the Yamhill-Carlton AVA, the range's peaks to the west and south buffer maritime winds and rain from the Pacific Ocean, creating a more temperate growing season distinct from neighboring vineyard sites. Planted in 2005-2006 to Pinot Noir and Chardonnay Dijon clones, the I94-acre vineyard perches in thin marine sedimentary soils, and diversity of block exposures and elevation offer a diverse palette for our farming and winemaking team.

WILLAKENZIE ESTATE

WillaKenzie Estate is located in the Yamhill-Carlton AVA in the Northern Willamette Valley, Oregon. The winery was established in 1991 by Bernard Lacroute, who was inspired by the Estate's dynamic rolling hills that reminded him of his Burgundian roots. The Estate is named for the marine sedimentary soil series on which the vineyard is planted, in keeping with tradition that great wines reflect a true sense of place. WillaKenzie remains committed to its sustainable practices by preserving the biodiversity of the land and is Oregon's first LIVE certified winery (#001).

VINTAGE NOTES

After a long, cold winter, bud break finally happened at the end of April. Once spring arrived, temperatures rose quickly and the weather was beautiful for all of May, causing flowering in early June. The majority of the growing season had moderate daytime temperatures and cool evenings, but we did have some late season warmth roll into the valley during veraison. This warm weather advanced grape development, so vintage started early, and we finished harvesting the entire estate by September 22nd. The resulting wines from 2023 are simply delicious, generous, and loaded with beautiful fruit flavors.

VITICULTURE & WINEMAKING

The grapes that were used to craft this 2023 Willamette Valley Rosé were hand-harvested just after sunrise on the mornings of September 2nd and September 6th. After picking, whole clusters were loaded into our press and gently squeezed to extract pure, fresh Pinot Noir juice. The juices were then transferred into temperature-controlled stainless-steel tanks for both settling and slow, cool fermentations to retain aromatic intensity and freshness. The wine was bottled on January 29, 2024.

OUR ESTATE

Since 1977, Matanzas Creek Winery has been creating site-expressive wines in the heart of Sonoma County. We blend artistry with storytelling by embracing a mosaic of grape clones, along with innovative fermentation techniques, to unlock the full potential of each varietal. Our wines are not just exceptional in taste; they capture the unique terroir of Sonoma County. All of our estate vineyards are certified by the California Sustainable Winegrowing Alliance, ensuring each bottle of Matanzas Creek Winery wine embodies the essence of Sonoma County for a better tomorrow.

WINEMAKING

To achieve a more delicate expression of this versatile varietal, Marcia chose to pick relatively early as compared to other California Chenin producers. This provided her signature acidity and a beautifully bright expression. Fermentation was controlled at low temperatures to preserve the vibrancy of the fruit. The wine was then split between stainless steel and neutral French oak barrels and puncheons to add complexity. We used a variety of yeast to emphasize the floral, citrus and tropical notes, and malo-lactic fermentation was suppressed to ensure a leaner palate with angular acidity and mouth-watering salinity, the perfect compliment to our diverse California cuisine!

VINTAGE NOTES

2023 was a cooler year in California, marked by a cold, wet spring, a mild summer, and early fall rains. To ensure our grapes ripened perfectly, we thinned out the canopy leaves to boost air flow and sun exposure. This careful management let the grapes ripen slowly, enhancing their complexity, flavor depth, and acidity. Despite the cooler weather, 2023 will stand out for producing exceptionally balanced, acidity-forward wines.





WINEMAKER'S NOTES

Classic and refined is the approach we take when crafting Merlot. We love varietal expression and this one has it in spades. The nose opens with notes of blueberry, cedar, carob, and baking spices. The palate is lush yet well-structured with flavors of black fruit compote, milk chocolate, oak spice, and cigar box. The tannins are evident but integrated and refined, giving it a long, lingering finish.

PRIMARY AVAS

Keyes (60%) - Located near the town of Angwin, at roughly 1,850 ft. elevation, this Howell Mountain vineyard sits adjacent to the Las Posadas State Forest, well above the marine layer, and with warm afternoon sun exposure. The summer days range from 55 to 90 degrees, with cool nights preserving the acidity. The mountainous soil is predominantly volcanic, shallow with low fertility, and producing merlot that expresses dark fruits like blackberry and dark currant, with a distinct minerality.

Missimer (14%) - Located on the valley floor in the Yountville AVA, this site is near the Napa River with good soil fertility. The Merlot from here is rich and densely textured with notes of blue and black fruit with well-structured tannins.

Buena Tierra (11%) - Located on Orchard Lane in the Oak Knoll AVA, the soil is a loose loam and produces wines that show bright fruit characters with savory undertones.

Benessere (10%) - Situated on the north end of the St. Helena AVA, this warmer location on the valley floor provides fruit with lots of plum and blueberry notes. The gravely soil leads to lower vigor with great minerality and elegant tannins.

GROWING SEASON NOTES

Vintage 2021 is a story of small but mighty. Drought conditions were prevalent in winter and spring. Temperatures were moderate during spring but began to warm significantly during summer. Flowering led to lighter than usual fruit set with low vine vigor. Warm conditions during ripening led to beautiful fruit flavors and intense color. Harvest started in mid-August with Sauvignon Blanc and carried on at a steady pace through September and October with red varieties. While low in volume, the wines are aromatic, lively and well-structured and we can't wait to share them with you.

HISTORY

Mt. Brave Vineyard sits high atop Mt. Veeder at an elevation of 1,400 to 1,800 feet. Mt. Veeder has been planted with winegrapes since the early 1860s by winemaking pioneers such as Charles Krug, Agoston Haraszthy, Frederick Hess and William S. Keyes. Wines from Mt. Veeder achieved recognition as early as the Paris Exposition of 1900. The parcel that became the Mt. Brave Vineyard, in the northern reaches of the Mt. Veeder American Viticultural Area, was originally purchased in 1841 before the Gold Rush and the Civil War.

VINEYARD AND ORGANIC FARMING

High-elevation winegrowing requires a painstaking, labor-intensive approach. Mt. Brave Vineyard's thin, rocky soils and steep slopes make water retention a challenge and erosion a threat, but the vines benefit from the struggle and produce concentrated flavors. The high altitude keeps midday temperatures cooler than those in the valley below, while the position above the fog line gives grapes longer daily exposure to sunlight. This regularly extends the growing season into November, and the increased hang-time results in peak ripeness and full varietal complexity. Mt. Brave Vineyard was certified organic in 2023 after a five-year transition. Not only has the fruit reached a new level of excellence, the vines are more resilient without artificial treatments. We are now approaching regenerative accreditation. We are proud to farm with methods that contribute to a better global climate, healthier land, and more compelling wines.

WINEMAKING

We hand-harvested grapes during cool morning hours as the fog blanketed the valley below. The wine was fermented in stainless steel and then underwent native malolactic fermentation in barrels to round acidity and softly integrate the vanillin character of French oak (70% new). After barrel aging for 22 months, the wine was bottled without fining or filtration.

WINEMAKER'S COMMENTS

The 2021 vintage started with just a little rain in winter and spring, followed by a moderate summer and cooler fall. The absence of heat spikes and moisture as the clusters finished ripening meant we could pick exactly when we felt the fruit was at its peak. This gentle growing season yielded vivid, fresh character. This Cabernet Franc evokes memory and possibility, with notes of raspberry and orange blossom lifted by ocean air. Lead pencil shavings and toast are nice grounding elements conveyed with a silky mouthfeel.

VINEYARD CHARACTER

The Hartford Russian River Valley Zinfandel is a blend of old-vine, dry-farmed and low yielding Zinfandel vineyards from the Russian River Valley. These old vineyards (average vineyard age is well over 115 years) offer an impressive expression of the varietal. Zinfandel grown in the Russian River Valley is distinctive with bright, natural acidity and vibrant fruit aromas and flavors which are a result of cool fog-laden nights and warm days. These dry-farmed vineyards planted on low-fertility soils consistently produce wines of exceptional density and extraction.

WINEMAKING

To preserve exotic spice and bright berry flavors, we use the same gentle handling techniques for making Zinfandel that we use with Pinot Noir:

- All hand harvested with hand sorting of both clusters and berries at the winery.
- Pre-fermentation cold soak, indigenous yeast fermentations in small open top fermenters.
- · Aged for 10 months in French oak barrels.
- No fining or filtration.

These artisan winemaking techniques allow the varietal character of Zinfandel to show through and express the Russian River Valley terroir.

TASTING NOTES

The 2022 Hartford Russian River Valley Zinfandel is showing aromas of ripe plum, blackberry, and black cherry which are highlighted with hints of white pepper and allspice. Blueberry, red raspberry, nutmeg and mocha flavors lead into a long, bright finish with supple tannins.
