Session 5, Feb 6: Dmitri Shostakovich and his colleagues

Despite the fearsome pressure of the Stalinist state, Dmitri Shostakovich was prolific, producing a wide range of symphonic works, operas, concertos, solo works, choral and chamber music for the 20th century canon. However, being promoted internationally by the Soviet State as the USSR's most celebrated composer meant he had a permanent target on his back. After being viciously attacked by Stalin at the height of his career, Shostakovich spent the rest of his life walking a terrifying thin line between being an apparently ideologically-pure Soviet composer, and secretly expressing his own artistic truths to those who knew how to decode them. His fellow Soviet composers Dmitri Kabalevsky and Aram Khachaturian managed to keep themselves somewhat safer by writing more accessible, less challenging music. We'll hear a selection of their masterpieces including symphonies, ballets and operas, and also film music by Prokofiev.
