Supplies needed:

- Yupo Watercolor Paper Pad 9 x 12, Bright White, 10 Sheets
- Arches Watercolor Pad 9" x 12", 140 lb, Rough, Fold-over, 12 Sheets
- Watercolor brushes look for high-quality synthetic brushes in various sizes such as: Princeton
- Velvetouch, Series 3950, Paint Brush for Acrylic, Oil and Watercolor, Set of 4
- Winsor & Newton Cotman- Sketcher's Pocket Box, Set of 12 Half Pans
- White Gouache
- Plastic straw
- Plastic pipettes
- Old toothbrush
- Masking tape
- Paper towels
- Container for water
- Grafix White Mask Liquid Frisket
- Old watercolor brush or cheap brush to use with masking fluid
- Rubbing Alcohol
- Spray bottle full of water
