### **SUPPLY LIST**

PATTERN NOTE - Making a garment that fits you is the major challenge of an online garment construction class. Students with previous garment construction experience may select their own pattern. Making a fitting muslin ahead of time is strongly recommended. *Please contact instructor ahead of time to discuss your choice.* [lauren4arts@gmail.com](mailto:lauren4arts@gmail.com)

***For ease of working together on-line, we will be making our quilted coat using a pattern based on a deconstructed sweatshirt.***

#### **For beginners**

- The pattern is the Beachcomber Jacket from [www.laundrybasketquilts.com](http://www.laundrybasketquilts.com)
- Long-sleeved crew neck sweatshirt, one size larger than normal. *Raglan sleeves OK.*
- 2 1/2 yards of pre-washed cotton quilting lining fabric
- 1/2 yard binding fabric
- 5 3/4 yards total assorted pre-washed cotton quilting fabrics as per pattern.

#### **OR For experienced sewist who wants a quilted coat**

- Vintage quilt to repurpose, at least twin size.
- 1/2 yard binding fabric
- Pattern of your choice, tested in a fitting muslin version

#### **OR For the quilter who wants a quilted coat from a commercial**

- 5 yards assorted pre-washed cotton fabrics for your own piecing
- Twin sized Quilter's Dream Request or Dream Green
- 2 1/2 yards pre-washed cotton lining
- Pattern of your choice, tested in a fitting muslin version

#### **All students will also need -**

A sewing machine they are familiar with  
Full sized sewing shears/scissors

Straight pins

Marking pencils

Good quality thread, neutral color or to blend with the garment

Steam iron

Ironing board

Pressing cloth (1/4 yd. muslin)

Rotary cutter, plus mat & rulers

Full length mirror

Optional - closures, buttons or zippers (May be purchased later)
