- Small spatulas to spread adhesives
- Tweezers, bamboo sticks (for picking)
- Paper towels
- Safety glasses

Depending on the exact project size selected, students may need to work a few hours outside of class.

A note about setting up your workspace for class: Please DO NOT use your phone as the primary viewing of the Zoom class, desk computer, laptop or tablet gives you a more pleasurable experience. A desk lamp is helpful.

To work along during class, you need a covered flat surface and your supplies handy. This can be a temporary setup if you do this from your home office; cover your desktop with newspaper. Enough space to accommodate your substrate, some elbow room for cutting, and paper plates or small containers to manage your materials.
