| 284-305: Diocletian and the Tetrarchy | (Maximian, Galerius, | Constantius Chlorus) |
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303-313: The Great Persecution

306: Death of Constantius Chlorus; Constantine (306-337) crowned Augustus in York

312: The Conversion of Constantine; Battle of Milvian Bridge, defeat and death of Maxentius

313: The 'Edict of Milan'; Donatist Schism in North Africa

c.318/321: Outbreak of the 'Arian Controversy'

324: Constantine's conquest of the east, death of Licinius

325: Council of Nicaea (first ecumenical council); homoousios

330: Dedication of Constantinople

337: Baptism and death of Constantine; accession of Constantine II (337-340), Constans (337-

350) and Constantius II (337-361)

361: Accession of Julian 'the Apostate' (361-363)

363: Persian Expedition, death of Julian

364: Empire divided between Valentinian I (364-375) and Valens (364-378)

378: Battle of Adrianople (death of Valens); accession of Theodosius I (379-395)

381: Council of Constantinople (second ecumenical council)

391-2: Anti-pagan legislation of Theodosius I

395: Death of Theodosius I, division of the empire between Arcadius (395-408) and Honorius (395-423)
