WINEMAKER NOTES

The 2023 sauvignon blanc incorporates our estate-grown sémillon and sauvignon musqué, that we planted on the Aperture property in 2019. These two estate blocks were hand-harvested in early September at the same time as the Sauvignon Blanc from Farrow Ranch in Geyserville. The sauvignon blanc from Dry Stack Vineyard in the Bennett Valley AVA was brought to the winery in early October, consistent with this vineyard's unique late-ripening characteristics.

Basing the pressure on the acid measurements, we lightly whole cluster press the fruit to a stainless steel tank where we let the juice chill at 50°F. After three days, we clean-rack it to a smaller tank leaving the heavy sediment behind. Three days later, fermentation starts naturally and keeps below 56°F until 18 brix when we transfer the young wine to barrels. There, it spends the remaining time on lees until just before bottling. Once transferred to barrel, the wine is placed in our cold barrel room to keep fermentation cool and slow to intentionally preserve the bright aromatics and fresh quality. As the wine slowly ferments for an additional 3 weeks in barrel, we top and stir weekly. The wine stays in those same barrels for 6 months.

VINEYARD

We harvest grapes from three vineyards for this wine. Our estate sémillon and sauvignon musqué in Russian River Valley, sauvignon blanc from Dry Stack Vineyard in Bennett Valley, and sauvignon blanc from our estate property, Farrow Ranch in Alexander Valley.

SOIL TYPE

Clay Loam
The soils are marine clay loam with many small to medium sized stones throughout the profile, helping drainage and soil texture.

STYLE AND DESCRIPTION

Cool terrior style wine, showing elegant top notes of lime, apple and tropical fruit, enhanced with a bouquet of toasty oak. Rich and lush mouthfeel. Serve with grilled vegetables, barbecued salmon or roasted turkey. Well balanced acidity will allow the wine to age to 6 years when cellared at 55° F - 60° F.

PRODUCTION NOTES

Hand harvested and whole cluster pressed in a diaphragm press. 96% barrel fermented in French and American oak. Completed malolactic in barrels.

2024 Pinot Meunier, Hopkins Vineyard

Russian River Valley, Sonoma County

Vineyard Profile

Hopkins Vineyard in the Russian River Valley once again delivers a standout vintage with its 2024 Pinot Meunier. A cooler-than-average spring gave way to a temperate, well-paced summer, allowing for steady ripening and excellent

flavor development. The hallmark fog of the region rolled in reliably, moderating afternoon warmth and contributing to a longer hang time. Yields remained modest, but the quality of fruit was exceptional, with concentrated aromatics, balanced acidity, and classic varietal character.

Winemaker's Notes

The limited-production 2024 Pinot Meunier from Christina's Vineyard is a wine that rewards both curiosity and food pairing. Bright violet-red in color, it offers a lively and expressive aromatic profile. On the nose, ripe red cherries, cranberries, and wild strawberries are layered with hints of sweet spice, cedarwood, and a touch of vanilla.

On the palate, this wine is light to medium in body with the silky texture of Pinot Noir but with a brighter, spicy edge. Bursting with red fruit and warm baking spices—think cinnamon stick and clove—it finishes long, clean, and layered with subtle oak notes and lively acidity.

The 2024 Pinot Meunier is an excellent food wine and a must-try. It's a perfect bottle to bring to your next tasting or dinner party—easy to enjoy, versatile at the table, and a charming expression of this lesser-known varietal.

While drinking beautifully now, it will continue to evolve over the next 3–5 years, gradually revealing deeper notes of forest floor, leather, and wet stone with age.



ST. FRANCIS WINERY & VINEYARDS
Sonoma County Old Vines Zinfandel

The grapes in this “Old Vines” Zinfandel were planted 50 to more than 100 years ago. Many of these historic vines are planted on St. George rootstock and are head-pruned and dry-farmed, producing low yields of fruit with highly concentrated, intense flavors and aromas. The grapes are de-stemmed and crushed before cold-soaking for three days to extract optimal color and flavor. The fruit is inoculated with many yeast strains to build complexity, then fermented in separate lots using a combination of pump overs and delestage to soften tannins. Secondary malolactic fermentation occurs in French oak. The wine ages in barrel for sixteen months before final blending and bottling.

HARVEST NOTE

The 2022 growing season started with early spring rains followed by ideal weather through late summer. Harvest began on August 15 with white and early ripening red varieties showing bright acidity and mouth-watering freshness. In September a period of triple digit heat over several days pushed maturity on the vines, until a few days of rain provided a refreshing break and gave the later-ripening fruit some extra hang time to develop deep rich color, remarkable aromatics and exquisite flavors.

TASTING NOTE

Vibrant and tempting, this wine shows off rich aromas of blackberry, blueberry and warm spices layered with flavors of black raspberry, cherry pie, dried fig and graham cracker. A touch of acidity accents the spicy notes of cinnamon, clove and white pepper that emerge on the finish.



STYLE AND DESCRIPTION

This Alexander Valley Special Reserve Merlot displays notes of cranberry, ripe strawberry, blueberry and dusty loam. Hints of caramel and toffee combine with fine, elegant tannins in a long and satisfying finish.

PRODUCTION NOTES

Destemming and crushing to fermentor and cold soak. Inoculated and then fermented at between 87° F - 91° F. Remontage twice daily. Malolactic fermentation in stainless steel; elevation in new, small (225L) oak barrels.

ESTATE CABERNET SAUVIGNON

TASTING NOTES

As a blend of our best Cabernet Sauvignon vineyard sites, the Estate bottling is one of the most compelling illustrations of the Stonestreet Mountain. We blend this wine with discerning precision, balancing aromatic intrigue, texture and the Mayacamas' signature structural elements into a pure reflection of the vintage. The 2019 Estate Cabernet Sauvignon starts out with fresh red and dark fruit aromas pomegranate and wild blackberry with notes of graphite and bay laurel undertones. As the wine opens in the glass, deep fruit flavors of plum skin and cranberry alongside bright cocoa dance on the palate. The mouthfeel is rich and inviting, framed with fine grain tannins, that support the fresh and vibrant finish. Cellar or enjoy now!
