SUPPLY LIST

Note that you will need additional materials for subsequent classes, as will be discussed during the first session. All items (except maybe the paper) can be found at Home Depot, Lowes, or most local hardware stores. If going to a smaller store you might want to call ahead about wood availability.

- One 1" x 4" x 8' pine board, look for one with few knots – note that 1 x 4 is a nominal size; this board will actually measure about 3/4" x 3 1/2"
- One 2" x 4" x 8' SPF (spruce, pine, or fir) wood stud, look for one with few knots – note that 2 x 4 is a nominal size; this stud will actually measure about 1 1/2" x 3 1/2"
- One panel 1/2" x 12" x 24" birch or other smooth plywood – these are sometimes called "project panels"
- **For all wood, do not get pressure-treated**
- One package of at least 25 drywall screws, 1" long, phillips head
- One package of at least 25 drywall screws, 1 1/4" long, phillips head
- One package of at least 25 drywall or deck screws, 2" long, phillips head
- Rubber sanding block and 10 sheets of 60-grit sandpaper
- Small container of wood glue
- At least 10 sheets of plain paper or a sketchbook, up to max. paper size 11"x17"
- Essential measuring/marketing tools: pencils, tape measure, steel ruler or straightedge (thicker = better)
- Optional measuring/marketing tools: combination square, protractor, triangle, small "torpedo" level, any other kind of square
