### SUPPLY LIST

#### Paper

Several sheets (3-5) of D'Arches, 140lb cold pressed watercolor paper. 16" x 20". Or 22" x 30". Please buy sheets, not pads or blocks. 22" x 30" sheets may be torn into quarters for ease of transportation

#### Palette

There are many commercially made palettes that work very well. I would recommend the "John Pike" or "Robert Wood" palette. Make sure that your palette has numerous compartments to hold your paints and a large mixing area.

#### Paint

Please use professional-grade tube watercolors. Brands may be mixed. This is a limited basic palette; feel free to add additional pigments of your liking

- Ultramarine blue
- Hansa yellow light
- Quinacridone rose
- Phthalo blue
- New gamboges
- Titanium white
- Winsor violet
- Pyrolle scarlet
- Quinacridone gold
- Neutral tint
- Sap green
- Quinacridone sienna

#### Brushes

Three basic brushes are needed. There is no universal numbering system established for brushes.

- 1" flat (wash brush)
- Medium pointed
- Small pointed
